- · Making learning visible through teacher clarity: ensuring our students know what they are learning, why they are learning it, and how they will know when they have achieved the learning. Through teacher clarity, we will work at helping our students set learning goals specific to them, and to provide effective feedback to help our students reach their next steps.
- · Including more Indigenous and Métis history and worldview in our lessons, classrooms, and school.

EYE Assessment

Pre-K and Kindergarten Early Years Evaluations will be shared during parent/student/teacher conferences as there will not be student growth report cards sent home in November for Pre-K or Kindergarten students.

The Early Years Evaluation assesses the following five aspects of early child development that are closely related to school preparedness and emergent literacy skills: Awareness of Self and Environment, Social Skills and Approaches to Learning, Cognitive Skills, Language and Communication, and Physical Development.



Parking & Pick Up

Just a reminder to those picking up children after school: Please DO NOT park at the back of the school between the little green men as this is designated for Pre-K bus parking only. Please ensure you have conversations with your child about using the crosswalks when crossing the road.



There will be no school on Friday, November 8th and Monday, November 11th.








Special Notes & Coming Events...
