OurSchoolSurvey Results

In May, our Grade 4 students completed the second snapshot of OurSCHOOL Survey.

Below are a few of the outcomes along with a couple of comments stating how the students rated our school:

- In our school students' sense of belonging went up 2%.
- In our school, students who reported having friends at school that they can trust went up 12%.
- In our school rates of self-reported anxiety have increased by 4%.
- In our school 94% of students valued school outcomes.
- In our school 90% of students had awareness of other cultures.
- In our school 74% of students had positive self-regulation. This increased by 7% since November.

Students were invited to tell us some of the things they really liked about school or things that would make it even better:

- Things that I like about school is that I have many different friends. Things that I want to be better is I want more gym time and also to be able to get more things to help kids with math.
- I love our school because there is fun things, kind people, and parks.
- What I like about Lakeview is that I am accepted for who I am.
- I like Lakeview because we get a lot of help, but I think it would be a bit better if all the grade 4s get to together more so that we can become better friends.
- All the teachers are nice and fun and funny. I want writing to be easy, and it is really fun at this school.

Keep Learning Growing All Summer Long!

Balance Screens with Play

Balance device time with outdoor play, creativity, movement, and family connection. Nature walks, bike rides, and time with loved ones all help children learn and grow.

Get Ready for Fall

As August approaches, begin easing back into routines with earlier bedtimes, reading time, and practicing independence with backpacks and lunch kits.
